10 11 _.	When selecting a foster home, the department shall consider the following placement options.
12 13 14	1. Relatives. Whenever possible, the department shall place the child with a relative or a member of the child's extended family.

1 2 3 4	A. Placement of the child with a relative shall be made in accordance with existing departmental rules and guidelines, but does not require the express approval of the commissioner.
5 6 7 8	(1) For the purposes of this section, the term "relative" includes an adult sibling, aunt, uncle, first cousin or grandparent of the child to be placed.
9 10 11	B. Placement of a child with an extended family member shall be made in accordance with the criteria set forth under this section.
12 13 14 15	(1) For purposes of this section, the term "extended family member" includes a godparent, 3rd cousin and a great aunt or uncle of the child to be placed.

8 C. A foster home chosen under this section for a child may not be used for any other child unless a current and full study of the home is subsequently conducted.

D. All foster parents chosen under this section shall be notified of this approval and departmental payment process at the outset of the home study of the home.

16 STATEMENT OF FACT

There is only one principle that should govern the placement of foster children and that is the needs of the children.

No one has a right to be a foster parent. A foster parent should be required to undergo a thorough review process which includes an investigation of the parent's life, sexual preference, motivation for wanting to be a foster parent and any other factors which are important and relevant. Criminal record checks must be done for all potential foster parents and references should be checked very carefully.

The guiding principle must be the ability of the family to provide a warm, stable, nurturing home for a child on a temporary basis. The presumption is always that the child will return to his natural parents.

Foster children are served best when placed in traditional family settings; that is, with relatives or in families with married couples, preferably with parenting experience and with time available to care for foster children.
