5. Penalty. The registered owner of a motor vehicle which is operated by him or another in noncompliance with this section commits a Class E crime.

### STATEMENT OF FACT

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The purpose of this bill is to make it a crime to pass a school bus with flashing red lights. Under this bill, it is the registered owner of the motor vehicle which is operated improperly who commits the crime, whether or not he is the actual operator.

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
