AN ACT to Create a Youth Fisheries and

Wildlife Conservation Education Program.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and Whereas, this pilot program should be in effect

Whereas, it is imperative that our secondary students learn about wildlife and wildlife management;

from early July to late August; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Pilot program. The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife with support and assistance of the Department of Conservation's SERVE Maine Program shall conduct a pilot program for secondary high school students to increase student awareness and understanding of fisheries and wildlife management principles and practices.

Ten secondary school students shall be selected annually to assist specific inland fisheries and wildlife and conservation law enforcement projects being undertaken by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. The program shall be for a 6-week to 8-week period during the summer recess.

To be eligible, the students must be between the ages of 15 and 18 years, enrolled in the freshman through junior years in a secondary school in the State and possess a Maine driver's license and be capable of providing their own transportation to the site of the project which they are assigned, unless public transportation is available.

Sec. 2. Program announcement. Secondary schools shall be annually advised of the program and application procedures by the department.

The department shall evaluate each application, the applicant's terest in inland fisheries and wildlife and the reasons for applying to the program. Ten applicate shall be selected on the basis of the informate presented by each applicant to work on specific partment of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife project which best match the interests and desires of the applicants and the department's ongoing work program. 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Sec. 8. Annual Report. The department shall annually report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over fisheries and wildlife on the merits and effectiveness of this program.

Sec. 9. Repeal. This Act shall be repealed on March 1, 1989.

13 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited 14 in the preamble, this bill shall take effect when ap-15 proved.

16 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill creates a pilot program which will provide a better understanding of the principles of game management and conservation to secondary students. It consists of a 6-week to 8-week internship with wildlife biologists and personnel of the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife for 10 students.

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
