### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

Resolve, to Provide a Retirement Benefit to Dorothy R. Lizzotte.

Retirement benefit. Resolved: That, notwithstanding the requirements of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 17851, subsection 2, paragraph B, the Maine State Retirement System shall provide to Dorothy R. Lizzotte the benefit provided by Title 5, section 17854; and be it further

Appropriation. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the General Fund the amount of \$15,450 which is the difference between the amount of Mrs. Lizzotte's accumulated contributions in the Maine State Retirement System, the only benefit to which Mrs. Lizzotte is entitled under the laws, and the

15 Mrs. Lizzotte is entitled under the laws, and the value of the benefit to which she will become entitled if this resolve is enacted.

Dorothy R. Lizzotte was employed by the Town of Winslow as a secretary in the school department for approximately 6 years and terminated employment in June, 1970, because of illness. At that time, the Maine State Retirement System laws required 10 years of service to qualify for ordinary disability retirement. Mrs. Lizzotte was 45 years of age and therefore not eligible for service retirement. As she did not have 10 years of service she was not "vested" which would have entitled her to apply for a retirement benefit upon reaching age 60 under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 17851, subsection 2.

This resolve is to waive the requirements in Title 5, section 17851, subsection 2, that a member not in service have at least 10 years of creditable service to qualify for a retirement benefit. This resolve would also waive the requirement in Title 5, section 17854, that a member have 10 years of creditable service to be entitled to a minimum of service retirement \$100 per month.

Mrs. Lizzotte is entitled to a refund of her contributions, plus interest, in the amount The retirements system's actuary has es-\$1,048.72. timated the reserves, present value of the benefit, required for the benefit that would be provided by this resolve to be \$16,500. The difference is Title 5, section 17155, provides that the entire actuarial cost of benefits granted by legislation such as this shall be fully funded by the same Legislature which enacts the special resolve or other legislation.
