4 5	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

7 8	§1455. Punitive damages in civil actions arising out of the operation of motor vehicles
9	In a civil action for damages arising out of the
10	operation of a motor vehicle, the plaintiff may be
11	awarded punitive damages if the defendant is found to
12	have been operating the motor vehicle while under the
13	influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs or a combi-
14	nation of liquor and drugs within the meaning of Ti-
15	tle 29, chapter 11, subchapter V.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to further discourage the operation of motor vehicles by persons under the 2 3 influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs by autho-4 rizing the award of punitive damages in civil actions when the plaintiff is claiming damages for an acci-51 6 dent caused by the operation of a motor vehicle and 7 8 when the defendant has been found to have been oper-9 ating the vehicle under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs. At present, punitive damages are 10 generally not available in those actions unless 11 the 12 defendant is shown to have acted intentionally. This bill makes clear that drunk driving is the type of conduct that the Legislature considers the proper 13 14 15 subject for a punitive damages' award to punish the drunk driver. 16

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
