12	all of the 3 underlined sentences (page 2, lines 1 to
13	15 in L.D.) and inserting in their place the follow-
14	ing: 'Minimum salaries established by those negotia-
15	tions shall be based upon a 180-day school year and
16 17	shall be proportionately higher for positions whose incumbents work for longer terms. Negotiations shall
18	establish pay schedules which enable the State to be
19	competitive with local school administrative units in
20	recruitment and retention with regard to teachers and
21	related classifications. The term "teachers and re-
22	lated classifications" includes any classification in
23	State Government which is a teaching classification,
24	requires professional work in or around the classroom
25	setting or is within the career ladder of the classi-
26	fications by virtue of its relationship to education-
27	al supervision or programming.'
28	STATEMENT OF FACT
29 30	This amendment requires negotiations for pay for teachers at state institutions and related classifi-
31 32	cations to be based on a year of 180 school days and clarifies the term "related classifications."
