COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 884, L.D.  
1185, Bill, "AN ACT to Clarify the State's Responsibility to Establish Competitive Pay Schedules for State Teachers and Related Classifications."

Amend the Bill in subsection 2 by striking out all of the 3 underlined sentences (page 2, lines 1 to 15 in L.D.) and inserting in their place the following: 'Minimum salaries established by those negotiations shall be based upon a 180-day school year and shall be proportionately higher for positions whose incumbents work for longer terms. Negotiations shall establish pay schedules which enable the State to be competitive with local school administrative units in recruitment and retention with regard to teachers and related classifications. The term "teachers and related classifications" includes any classification in State Government which is a teaching classification, requires professional work in or around the classroom setting or is within the career ladder of the classifications by virtue of its relationship to educational supervision or programming.'

This amendment requires negotiations for pay for teachers at state institutions and related classifications to be based on a year of 180 school days and clarifies the term "related classifications."
