STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Clarify the State's Responsibility to Establish Competitive Pay Schedules for State Teachers and Related Classifications.

6 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 7 follows:

20-A MRSA \$13507-A, sub-\$2, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 797, \$52, is amended to read:

2. <u>Minimums</u>. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the State and the bargaining agent for state teachers in state-operated schools and related classifications shall at a minimum, in accordance with bargaining procedures set forth in Title 26, chapter 9-B, negotiate as to the impact of implementation of sections 13403 and 13404. The negotiations shall be

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limited to salaries. The minimum salaries shall 1 be based upon a school year of the same length as teach-ers in local school administrative units and shall be 2 3 proportionately higher for positions whose incumbents 4 5 work for longer terms. Negotiations shall establish pay schedules which enable the State to be competi-6 tive with local school administrative units in re-7 cruitment and retention with regard to teachers 8 and related classifications. The term "teachers and re-9 lated classifications" includes any classification in State Government which is a teaching classification 10 11 or 12 requires similar qualifications, abilities or 13 tasks or is within the career ladder of the classifications by virtue of its relationship to educational 14 15 supervision or programming.

STATEMENT OF FACT

state law established minimum salaries for 17 When teachers, it soon became clear that pay scales for 18 teachers had to be modified to meet these minimum 19 20 salaries and to make the State competitive in the re-21 cruitment of teachers with local schools which were 22 establishing new pay scales. Additionally, pay 23 scales for state classifications which required simi-24 lar qualifications, abilities and tasks or which are 25 in the same career ladder had to be modified to maintain internal equity. The 112th Legislature enacted 26 the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, 27 section 13507-A, to enable these goals to be achieved through 28 29 collective bargaining.

30 This bill clarifies the State's responsibility 31 under this section by providing more specific in-32 structions.

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
