1 2 3 4 5	RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine Relating to Salaries Received by Judges Who have been Relieved of Their Duties.
6 7 8 9	Constitutional amendment. RESOLVED: Two thirds of each branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be proposed:
10	Constitution Art. VI, §2 is amended to read:
11 12 13 14 15	Section 2. Compensation. The Justices of the Supreme Judicial Court and the Judges of other courts shall, at stated times receive a compensation, which shall not be diminished during their continuance in office; but they shall receive no other fee or reward

for their services as Justices or Judges. If a Jus-

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tice or Judge is relieved of his duties pending any investigation for possible misconduct, that Justice or Judge shall not receive compensation for the period of time that he is relieved of his duties, but, if it is determined that no misconduct occurred, he may be paid that compensation for that period of time.

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Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved: That the city aldermen, town selectmen and plantation assessors of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

"Shall the Constitution of Maine be amended to provide that Judges relieved of their duties pending investigation of possible misconduct not be paid during that period of time?"

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots shall be received, counted and declared in open ward, town and sorted, plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal voters are in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment shall become part of the Constitution on the date of the proclamation.

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

# STATEMENT OF FACT

5	shall not be paid during that time. If it is deter-
6	mined that no misconduct occurred, he may be repaid
7	for the compensation lost.
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
