AN ACT to Create the Maine Choice

4 5	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

8	Maine Choice Scholarship Program
9	§12601. Maine Choice Scholarship Program
.0	There is established the Maine Choice Scholarship
.1	Program to recognize Maine high school graduates who
.1 .2	attain high academic achievement and to provide fi-
.3	nancial assistance for post-secondary education of

- high school students. The program shall recognize outstanding high school students as described in section 12602 and disburse interest free loans as described in section 12603. The program shall be administered by the commissioner.
 - §12602. Maine Choice scholars
- Each year graduating high school seniors who show evidence of academic achievement shall be considered for recognition as Maine choice scholars. Nominations and applications shall be submitted to the commissioner at a time and in a format to be determined by rule of the commissioner. The commissioner shall determine the finalists.
- 14 The Governor shall announce the names of those 15 individuals who are recognized as Maine Choice 16 scholars.

§12603. Allocation of funds

- 1. Loans. Loans of up to 1/2 of the student's unmet financial need or \$2,000 per academic year, whichever is less, or \$10,000 total may be made to eligible individuals. Loans shall be for one academic year and shall be automatically renewed if the recipient maintains a grade point average of 2.5 based on a 4.0 grade point system.
- 2. Limit on disbursements. The commissioner may not expend the first \$50,000 of income to the fund each year.

§12604. Eligibility requirements

1. Eligibility for post-secondary education loans. Post-secondary education loans shall be given only to a high school graduate who is a resident of the State, who has been recognized as a Maine choice scholar and who has met other eligibility criteria established by rule of the commissioner. Preference shall be given to students enrolled in a program which has been determined to be an underserved subject area.

)	1 2 3 4 5	2. Determination of underserved areas. The commissioner, in conjunction with the Director of the State Development Office, shall make a determination of underserved areas by considering the following information:
)	6 7 8 9	A. Statistics on current employment patterns provided by the Bureau of Labor Standards, detailing the level of qualified applicants available; and
	10 11	B. Numbers of students currently enrolled in programs leading to degrees in given professions.
	12 13 14	3. Underserved areas. "Underserved areas" means areas of professional expertise which currently are served by an insufficient pool of job applicants.
	15	§12605. Payment provisions
	16 17 18 19 20	Payment of loans shall be made directly on a semester basis only to the institution for credit to the student's account and be made within 60 days following evidence that the student has become duly enrolled at the post-secondary institution.
	21 22 23 24 25 26 27	If a recipient of a loan withdraws from an institution and if the student is entitled to a refund of tuition, fees or other charges, the institution shall pay directly to the State from that refund a sum which represents the portion of the loan paid to the student for the portion of the academic year that the student did not complete.
	28	§12606. Repayment and return service provisions
	29 30 31 32 33 34 35 36	Each recipient of a loan may cancel the total amount of the loan by completing 4 years of return services through employment in the student's field of study in the State. Return service for this purpose shall be performed within 5 years of graduation from the institution of higher education. Failure to fulfill the return service option shall necessitate repayment to the State as follows.
	37 38	 Time for repayment. The total debt shall be repaid to the State within 5 years of graduation from

1 2 3	the institution of higher education according to a schedule established by the commissioner. Due dates for repayments shall be set by the commissioner.
4 5 6 7 8 9	2. Deferment. A recipient of a loan may seek a deferment of the annual principal payments for a period not to exceed 2 years. A request for deferment must be made to the commissioner who shall make a determination on a case-by-case basis. The decision of the commissioner shall be final.
10	§12607. Nonlapsing revolving fund
11 12 13 14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21	A nonlapsing, interest earning, revolving fund, known as the Maine Choice Scholarship Fund, is created to implement the purposes of this chapter. Any unexpended balance of funds shall be carried over for continued use in the program and funds returned through loan repayments shall be invested by the Treasurer of State, as provided by law, with the earned income to be added to the fund. The revolving fund may receive, invest and expend money from gifts, grants, bequests and donations, in addition to money appropriated by the State. Appropriation. The following funds are appropri-

STATEMENT OF FACT

2	This bill creates a Maine Choice Scholarship Fund
3	to encourage higher education in this State. With
4	decreasing availability of federal funding, it is im-
5	portant that the State assume an active role in pro-
6	viding its citizens with educational assistance. The
7	Maine Choice Scholarship Fund is an attempt to pro-
8	vide educational incentive to students choosing to
9	enroll in occupations currently underserved in the
10	State.

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
