No member who is otherwise entitled to service credit for military leave may be deprived of these credits if the member's return to membership service is delayed beyond 90 days after his separation from the service in the Armed Forces of the United States, under conditions other than dishonorable or for bad conduct, if the delay is caused by an illness or disability incurred in the service in the armed forces.

PL 1985, c. 801, \$\$5 and 7, is repealed and the fol-1 2 3 lowing enacted in its place: A member may not receive credit for military 4 leave on any day which the member has already re-5 6 ceived state compensation or state retirement credits or which is beyond a cumulative of 4 7 8 years' military service, unless: (1) The member's return to active duty in the armed forces or the extension of the pe-9 10 11 riod of service beyond 4 years is required 12 by some mandatory provision; and 13 (2) The person presents proof of the return 14 to or extension of service satisfactory to 15 the board. 16 Sec. 3. 5 MRSA §17760, sub-§2, as enacted by 17 1985, c. 801, §§5 and 7, is amended to read: 2. Service before becoming a member. A member 18 19 who served as a full-time active duty member of the 20 armed forces or national guard before becoming a member of the retirement system is entitled to service 21 credit for the period of time he served in the armed 22 23 forces, under the following terms and conditions. 24 A. On the date of retirement, the member must have at least 15 years of creditable service. 25 26 Service credit under this subsection is lim-27 ited to 4 years. 28 The member must have separated from the armed 29 forces under conditions other than dishonorable 30 or for bad conduct. 31 Except as provided in paragraph E, the member 32 must have begun membership before January 1, 33 1976. 34 E. A member who served in the armed forces at any time from August 5, 1964, to May 7, 1975, is 35
