24 STATEMENT OF FACT

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Part A of the bill provides a block grant to assist school administrative units to cover the cost of teacher salaries.

Part B brings the funding formula calculation of subsudizable cost up to an estimate of current year expenditures.

Part C assists school administrative units to cover the cost of extensive minor capital costs.

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
