14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25	Patients involuntarily committed to a mental hospital must have been examined by a physician or clinical psychologist within 3 days of that admission. Involuntary admission requires a judicial process. Lawyers who represent the patient have their fees paid by the courts. Physicians and psychologists who certify Medicaid patients likewise have their professional fees paid by Medicaid. Physicians and psychologists who certify non-Medicaid patients do not have their professional fees paid. This bill requires health insurance to include the cost of this certification as a part of its benefits.
