AN ACT Relating to Boards and Commissions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 3 MRSA c. 13, as amended, is repealed.

Sec. 2. 5 MRSA c. 18, as amended, is repealed.

Sec. 3. 5 MRSA c. 379, first 3 lines, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 812, §39, are repealed and the following enacted in their place:

CHAPTER 379

BOARDS, COMMISSIONS, COMMITTEES AND SIMILAR ORGANIZATIONS

SUBCHAPTER I

1 COMPENSATION

2 Sec. 4. 5 MRSA §12003-A, sub-§10 is enacted to  
3 read:

4 10. Advisory boards. Members of any board which  
5 serves exclusively as an advisory board, particularly  
6 those boards described in section 12004-I, shall be  
7 deemed not to be officers of the State within the  
8 meaning of the Constitution of Maine and shall not be  
9 required to be commissioned or certified by the Sec-  
10 retary of State as provided in section 84.

11 Sec. 5. 5 MRSA §12004, as amended by PL 1985,  
12 c. 819, Pt. A, §7, is repealed and the following en-  
13 acted in its place:

14 §12004. Classifications and definitions of boards

15 Boards established or authorized by this chapter  
16 shall be classified according to the similarities of  
17 the powers and duties of the several boards. Members  
18 of boards shall be eligible for the rate of compensa-  
19 tion specified for each board, except where compensa-  
20 tion is not authorized. A reference to the statutory  
21 description of each board shall also be provided.  
22 For the purposes of sections 12004-G to 12004-J, the  
23 term "field" does not designate the state agency or  
24 department with which a board is associated or affil-  
25 iated, but only refers to the generic subject matter  
26 before the board.

27 The definitions of responsibilities and authority  
28 of each classification of boards may not necessarily  
29 apply in total to each board within each classifica-  
30 tion. Each board may possess some but not all of the  
31 responsibilities and authority as defined for the  
32 classification in which the board is included. The  
33 primary function of each board complies with the pri-  
34 mary responsibilities and authority of the classifi-  
35 cation in which the board is included.

36 Sec. 6. 5 MRSA §§12004-A to §12004-L are enacted  
37 to read:

38 §12004-A. Occupational and professional licensing  
39 boards

1           The primary responsibilities of occupational and  
2 professional licensing boards include the examination  
3 of applicants, issuance of licenses or certificates,  
4 registration of licenses and regulation of licensees  
5 with respect to the practice of a particular occupa-  
6 tion or profession. The primary powers of these  
7 boards include the authority to hold hearings, adopt  
8 rules, establish standards and procedures, issue li-  
9 censes and initiate action for the revocation or sus-  
10 pension of occupational or professional licenses.

11           For purposes of any occupational or professional  
12 licensing boards which have a public member or mem-  
13 bers, "public member" means a person who has no fi-  
14 nanacial interest in the profession regulated by the  
15 board to which he has been appointed and who has nev-  
16 er been licensed, certified or given a permit in the  
17 occupation or profession for which he is appointed to  
18 regulate.

24                                           STATEMENT OF FACT

25                   The purpose of this bill is to improve the func-  
26                   tioning of boards and commissions, facilitate the  
27                   process of appointments of board members, assure to  
28                   the greatest possible extent that boards serve the  
29                   public welfare and to terminate inactive and unneces-  
30                   sary boards. To achieve this purpose, this bill:

31                   A. Terminates 30 boards which are inactive, no  
32                   longer necessary or useful or have been repealed by  
33                   previous laws in other parts of the laws. The boards

10           B. Authorizes state agencies to form ad hoc ad-  
11           visory boards to advise an agency with respect to a

14           C. Declares that members of advisory boards are  
15           not officers of the State within the meaning of the  
16           Constitution of Maine and thereby removes the re-  
17           quirement that these members be commissioned by the  
18           Secretary of State;

19           D. Requires that each board appoint a clerk who  
20           is responsible for reporting board activities to the  
21           Secretary of State and the Commissioner of Finance;

22           E. Provides resources to the Secretary of State  
23           to provide the Governor, the Speaker of the House and  
24           the President of the Senate with a list of positions  
25           on boards and commissions for which appointments are  
26           necessary for that year. This will enable the ap-  
27           pointing authorities to make timely appointments. In  
28           addition, these resources will be used to develop a  
29           better computer program system that will generate  
30           much more information about board membership and ac-  
31           tivities;

32           F. Combines the arbitration and property assess-  
33           ment and valuation categories of boards because of  
34           their similar duties and responsibilities;

35           G. Removes the confirmation requirement for mem-

1 bers of the Natural Resource Financing and Marketing  
2 Board and the Animal Welfare Board; and

3 H. Increases the per diem rate of compensation  
4 for the following boards:

5 1. State Claims Board - Per diem increased from  
6 \$100 to \$150 a day;

7 2. Board of Trustees, Maine State Retirement  
8 System - Per Diem increased from \$50 a day to  
9 legislative per diem; and

10 3. Maine Health and Higher Education Facilities  
11 Authority - Provided with legislative per diem.  
12 Previously no per diem was paid.
