1	2. Waiver. The state agency shall waive the re-
2	quirement described in subsection 1, paragraph B, for
3	any category of services described in that paragraph
4	if the area agency on aging demonstrates to the state
5	agency that services being furnished for the category
	in the area are sufficient to meet the need for those
7	services in an area.

- A. Before an area agency on aging requests a waiver under this subsection, the area agency on aging shall conduct a timely public hearing in accordance with this paragraph. The area agency on aging requesting a waiver shall notify all interested parties in the area of the public hearing and furnish all parties with an opportunity to testify.
- 3. Direct provisions of services by area agency. The area agency on aging shall assure that no supportive services or nutrition services will be directly provided, except where, in the judgment of the state agency, provision of such services by the area agency on aging is necessary to assure an adequate supply of the services, or where the services are directly related to the area agency on aging's administrative function, or where the services of comparable quality can be provided more economically by the area agency on aging.
- 4. Approval of area plan. The director shall approve any area plan which he finds fulfills the requirements of subsection 1, paragraphs A to E.

30 STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to bring the law on coordinated community programs for Maine's elderly into conformity with the United States Older Americans Act, which was amended in 1984 by Public Law 98-459.
