(Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and			
	Whereas, currently, the railroad right-of-way from Augusta to Topsham is rarely used for rail			

Whereas, the Interstate Commerce Commission

soon grant permission to Maine Central Railroad to

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abandon the line from Topsham to Augusta; and

Whereas, the State may be forced to take immediate at action to protect its rights in the right-of-way; and

Whereas, the right-of-way is a significant and valuable asset to the State and to the communities through which it runs; and

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Whereas, a coordinated planning process to determine future uses of the right-of-way is both desirable and necessary for the State, the municipal governments, businesses, abutters and other citizens of communities along the right-of-way, and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Examine Alternative Uses for the Augusta to Topsham Railroad Right-of-way is established, consisting of 5 members: Two members of the Senate to be appointed by the President of the Senate and 3 members of the House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House. The chairman of the commission shall be elected from its membership; and be it further

Study. Resolved: That the commission shall examine alternate uses for the railroad right-of-way existing between Topsham and Augusta; coordinate a regional planning process for the use of the right-of-way; and recommend strategies for the acquisition of all or part of the right-of-way; recommend any necessary legislation to carry out the commission's findings and recommendations; and be it further

Technical Advisory Group. Resolved: That commission establish the Technical Advisory Group to advise and assist the commission in its study. group shall be made up of at least one representative officers of the municipalities of each from the Richmond, Topsham, Bowdoin, Gardiner, Farmingdale, Hallowell least 2 public members, and Augusta; at
