IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Concerning Housing for Hearing Ear Dogs and Seeing Eye Dogs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 17 MRSA §1312, sub-§§5 and 6 are enacted to read:

Housing accommodations; persons with guide 5. 9 dogs. Every blind or visually handicapped individual who has a sight-assistance animal, such as a guide dog, is entitled to full and equal access to all housing accommodations provided for in this section. Blind or visually impaired individuals may not be reextra quired to pay compensation to keep

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sight-assistance animals. A blind or visually impaired person shall be liable for any damages done to
the premises by the animal.

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6. Housing accommodations; definitions. "Housing accommodations," as used in this section, means any real property, or portion of real property, which is used or occupied, or is intended, arranged or designed to be used or occupied, as the home, residence or sleeping place of one or more human beings, including, but not limited to, public housing projects and all forms of publicly assisted housing, single and multifamily rental and sale units, lodging places, condominiums and cooperative apartments. "Housing accommodations" does not include:

A. The rental of a housing accommodation in a building which contains housing accommodations for not more than 2 families living independently of each other, if the owner or members of the owner's family reside in that housing accommodation; or

B. The rental of a room or rooms in a housing accommodation, if the rental is by the occupant of the housing accommodation or by the owner of the housing accommodation and the owner or members of the owner's family reside in that housing accommodation.

27 Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §3612, sub-§§5 and 6 are enacted 28 to read:

5. Housing accommodations; 29 persons with hearing-assistance animals. Every hearing impaired 30 31 individual who has a hearing-assistance animal is en-32 titled to full and equal access to all housing accommodations provided for in this section. Hearing im-paired individuals may not be required to pay extra 33 34 35 compensation to keep hearing-assistance animals. A 36 hearing impaired person shall be liable for any dam-37 ages done to the premises by the animal.

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signed to be used or occupied, as the home, residence or sleeping place of one or more human beings, including, but not limited to, public housing projects and all forms of publicly assisted housing, single and multifamily rental and sale units, lodging places, condominiums and cooperative apartments. "Housing accommodations" does not include:

A. The rental of a housing accommodation in a building which contains housing accommodations for not more than 2 families living independently of each other, if the owner or members of the owner's family reside in that housing accommodation; or

B. The rental of a room or rooms in a housing accommodation, if the rental is by the occupant of the housing accommodation or by the owner of the housing accommodation and the owner or members of the owner's family reside in that housing accommodation.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This new draft adds a new section to the bill to extend the same protections the bill grants to people with hearing-assistance animals to persons with sight-assistance animals, such as guide dogs. The language of both the bill and this new draft refers to animals in general, rather than restricting to only dogs. This will allow the law to accommodate advances in technology as they occur. For example, trained monkeys are often used as assistance animals for paraplegics.

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
