3 4	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
5 6	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6601, sub-§6, as repealed and replaced by PL 1981, c. 297, §3, is amended to read:
7 8 9 10	6. <u>Definition</u> . For the purposes of this subchapter, "shellfish" means clams, quahogs other than mahogany quahogs, oysters and-mussels and includes shellstock and shucked shellfish.
11 12	Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §6651, sub-§§1 and 2, as amended by PL 1983, c. 838, §1, are further amended to read:
13 14	l. Fees to be paid into fund. Fifty-three percent of all fees from shellfish licenses, mussel

1 2 3		hand-raking and boat licenses, shellfish transportation licenses and wholesale seafood licenses shall be paid into the Shellfish Fund.
4 5 6 7 8		2. <u>Uses of fund</u> . The commissioner may expend the money in the Shellfish Fund for management, enforcement, restoration, development and conservation of shellfish <u>and mussels</u> in the intertidal zone or coastal waters.

13		§6745. Hand-raking mussel license
14 15 16 17 18	-	1. License required. It is unlawful for any person to engage in the activities authorized under this section without a current mussel license or other license issued under this Part authorizing the activities.
19 20 21 22		2. Licensed activity. The holder of a hand-raking mussel license may take mussels by hand raking or possess, ship, transport or sell mussels he has taken.
23 24 25		3. Eligibility. A hand-raking mussel license shall only be issued to an individual and shall be a resident license.
26 27 28 29		4. Exception. In any one day, any person may take or possess not more than 2 bushels of shell mussels or 4 quarts of shucked mussels for personal use without a mussel license.

33 34 35		1. License required. It is unlawful for any person to use a boat for dragging for mussels unless that boat carries a current mussel boat license is-

sued by the commissioner.

1 2 3 4 5 6 7	2. Licensed activity. A boat license under this section may be used for dragging for mussels. The license shall also authorize the captain and up to 2 crew members aboard the licensed boat when engaged in dragging for mussels to undertake these activities. 3. Eligibility. A mussel boat license shall only be issued to an individual who is a resident.
8 9 10 11	4. Exception. In any one day, any person may take or possess not more than 2 bushels of shell mussel or 4 quarts of shucked mussels for personal use without a mussel license.
12 13	5. Fee. The fee for a mussel boat license is \$110.
14	§6747. Closed areas
15 16 17 18	1. Taking from closed areas. It is unlawful to fish for or take mussels from any area closed by regulation or to possess, ship, transport or sell mussels so taken.
19 20 21 22	2. Washing or holding in closed areas. It is unlawful to wash, hold or keep mussels in any area closed by regulation or to possess, ship, transport or sell mussels so washed, held or kept.
23	3. Exception. This section shall not apply to:
24 25	A. The taking of mussels under the authority of section 6856; or
26 27 28 29	B. Mussels kept or washed in waters sterilized with a system that has been approved in writing by the commissioner, provided that the waters are also approved for that use.

2 This bill creates mussel harvesting licenses 3 recommended by the legislative study on blue mussel 4 harvesting. Currently, mussels are regulated under the general shellfish provisions which are geared

5 6 toward soft-shell clam harvesting. The license for 7 clams is set at a low \$15 in recognition of the high cost of many municipal shellfish licenses. 8

9 This bill removes mussels from general shellfish 10 provisions and establishes a separate subchapter to 11 regulate their harvest. Two licenses are established, a hand-raking license and a boat license. 12 1.3 The subchapter also prohibits the taking of mussels 14 from closed areas.
