1 2 3	AN ACT Concerning Removal of Submerged Watercraft in Coastal Waters of this State.
4 5	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

9 .0 .1	1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
2 3 4	A. "Owner" means a person who claims lawful pos- session of a watercraft by virtue of legal title or equitable interest in the watercraft which
5	entitles him to possession

B. "Watercraft" means any type of vessel, boat, barge, float or craft used or capable of being used as a means of transportation on water other than a seaplane. The definition does not include watercraft under 20 feet in length.

- C. "Coastal waters of this State" means all waters and all federal waters within the jurisdiction of this State within the rise and fall of the tide, not above a dam or fishway when it divides tidewater and fresh water.
- 2. Notice of submerged watercraft to be given to department. The owner of any watercraft, which becomes submerged or partially submerged in the coastal waters of this State, shall notify immediately, by the fastest means of communication, the Commissioner of Marine Resources of the event and the location of the watercraft.
- The commissioner shall notify, upon receiving notice of a submerged or partially submerged watercraft, the State Police Chief; the Commissioner of Environmental Protection and the municipality which has jurisdiction over the water.
 - 3. Formal request by department to federal authorities. The commissioner shall notify, upon receiving notice of a submerged or partially submerged watercraft, the proper federal authorities and make a formal request for removal of the submerged or partially submerged watercraft in accordance with federal rules and regulations. The commissioner shall notify the owner of the watercraft, the State Police Chief, the Commissioner of Environmental Protection and the municipality which has jurisdiction over the water of the response of the federal authorities.
 - 4. Federal authorities not responsible for removal; owner legally liable to remove watercraft. If the response of the federal authorities does not provide for removal of the watercraft by the Federal Government, the commissioner shall give notice to and require the owner of the watercraft who shall be legally liable to remove any watercraft submerged or partially submerged in the coastal waters of this State and pay any damages resulting from the

	submersion or removal. The watercraft shall be re-
	moved within 60 days of notification from the commis-
) ()	sioner or within 60 days of "ice out" in the body of
	water, unless the commissioner determines that the
	watercraft creates a health or safety hazard. If the
	commissioner determines that the watercraft creates a
	health or safety hazard, he shall order the owner to
	remove the watercraft immediately. If the owner
	fails to remove the watercraft upon order of the com-
	missioner, the commissioner shall request, in writ-
	ing, the court to direct the owner to remove the ve-
'	hicle immediately.

- 5. Method of removal. Method of removal of the submerged or partially submerged watercraft must be in compliance with the State's land use and environmental laws.
- 6. Penalties. A conviction or adjudication of any person for a violation of this section is a civil violation for which a forfeiture equal to the estimated cost of removal may be adjudged. In addition to a forfeiture or instead of a forfeiture, the judge may direct the person convicted to remove the watercraft.
- 7. Rules. The commissioner may promulgate, in accordance with the provisions of the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, any rules necessary to carry out the purposes of this chapter.
- 8. Ordinances. The municipality which has jurisdiction over the water may adopt any ordinances necessary to carry out the purposes of this Act.
- 9. Abandonment of watercraft by owner. If the owner of the watercraft cannot be located and federal authorities are not responsible for removal, those watercraft that have been submerged for a period of longer than 60 days shall be deemed abandoned and may be removed at the expense of the State. The State, in such case, shall bear no liability toward the former owner of the watercraft. Any funds derived from the sale of a watercraft removed by the State shall first be applied to the costs of State Government and local government directly related to the
