1 2 3	AN ACT to Provide Pension Rights to Morris G. Pilot.
4 5	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
6 7 8	Sec. 1. Pension rights for Morris G. Pilot. Morris G. Pilot shall have the pension rights granted in this Act.
9 10 11 12 13	Sec. 2. Retirement pension. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 4, chapter 29, Morris G. Pilot, on reaching the age of 65, shall have the right to a pension equal to 35% of his average final compensation as a District Court Judge. "Average final compensation" is defined in the Maine Revised

2 3 4	pension shall be adjusted annually by a cost-of-living factor, as determined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 4, section 1358.
5 6 7 8 9 10 11	Sec. 3. Survivors benefits. On the death of Morris G. Pilot, his spouse Ann S. Pilot, if living, shall receive a pension equal to 35% of his average final compensation or his retirement allowance at the time of his death, whichever is greater. The pension shall be adjusted annually by a cost-of-living factor as determined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 4, section 1358.
13 14 15 16	Sec. 4. Funding. Benefits provided in this Act shall be funded solely by the State in the same manner as provided under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 4, section 1403.
17	FISCAL NOTE
18 19	There will be a future cost starting in 1991. The pension will start at \$10,036.
20	STATEMENT OF FACT
21 22 23	The new draft changes the benefit to 35%, removes the daughter who is over 18 years of age and adds a fiscal note.
