)	2 3 4 5 6 7 8	This new draft increases the number of eligibl participants in the Elderly Low-cost Drug Program It requires total appropriations of \$1,541,400 an \$2,045,200 in fiscal years 1987-88 and 1988-89, respectively. Included in these amounts are \$30,00 each year to cover the additional administrative costs of the Bureau of Taxation.
