Committee. Resolved: That the committee shall consist of 3 members from the Joint Standing Committee on Labor and 3 members from the Joint Standing Committee on Banking and Insurance. The President of Senate shall appoint one Senator from the Joint Standing Committee on Labor and one Senator from the Joint Standing Committee on Banking and Insurance and Speaker of the House shall appoint 2 Representatives from the Joint Standing Committee on Labor and Representatives from the Joint Standing Committee Banking and Insurance. The President of the Senon Banking and Insurance. and the Speaker of the House shall be ex officio members of the committee. The appointing authorities shall make the appointments within 30 days following passage of this resolve and shall notify the Legislative Council in writing of their selections. Chairman of the Legislative Council shall call first meeting of the committee and the committee shall select a chairman from among its members; and be it further

Findings. Resolved: That the committee shall present its findings, together with any necessary recommended legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 113th Legislature; and be it further

Compensation. Resolved: That legislative members of the committee shall receive the legislative per diem as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for days of attendance at committee meetings. If the committee meets on a day when the Legislature is in session, legislative members shall receive only one legislative per diem on that day, but may be reimbursed for all necessary expenses upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council; and be it further

Staff assistance. Resolved: That the commission may request staff assistance from the Legislative Council. All agencies and departments of State Government, including the Workers' Compensation Commission, the Bureau of Labor Standards, the Commission

amendment establishes the Joint Select Committee to Study the Costs of Providing Benefits and Compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act. The workers' compensation system has been the subject of intense public debate and scrutiny in recent The object of this study is to determine if, vears. as has often been charged, the costs of providing workers' compensation coverage in Maine than other states. Ιf inordinately higher those costs are found to be higher, the committee will investigate the reasons for the increased costs. committee is given a broad mandate to investigate the causes of any increased costs and is provided with assistance from all agencies and departments of State Government, as well as staff assistance from the Legislative Council.

No true reform of the workers' compensation system can occur without reliable, objective information substantiating the problems within the system. No rational effort can be made to find a solution to the problem until the exact area of the problem has been identified. The purpose of this study is to identify the cause of any problems in the workers' compensation system, if they exist, and to suggest solutions designed to address the precise areas of difficulty.
