24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33	The number of individuals in the State with Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome has grown rapidly to 45 individuals as of March, 1987. It is anticipated that this serious viral epidemic will continue to result in a growing number of the State's citizens being confirmed as having AIDS, AIDS-related complex, APS or other related conditions. These individuals have many human service needs that are currently not being met despite the concerted efforts of a few community-based staff and volunteers.

35 36 This bill provides funds for the development of a client support services system for individuals infected with the human immune deficiency virus.

1	Community-based agencies will be provided funds to
2	assist individuals to obtain access to necessary
