Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, growth and land use pressures are increasing at a rapid rate in many Maine communities; and

Whereas, this growth has a potentially significant impact on municipal and state infrastructure, natural resources and scenic beauty, housing opportu-

nities, resource-based industries and the quality of life; and

Whereas, growth and development in Maine communities must be carefully planned to ensure that it occurs in an orderly manner; and

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37 38 Whereas, the State should assist municipalities to properly plan growth; and

Whereas, a study of growth pressures in Maine communities, its effects on those communities and methods to better plan and manage growth is necessary; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Commission on Growth Pressures in Maine Communities. There is established a Commission Pressures in Maine Communities. The commission shall be composed of 14 members. The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House shall each appoint one member from each of the following joint standing committees: Economic Development, State and Local Government and Energy and Natural Resources. The Governor shall appoint the following members: The the State Planning Office, the Director of of the State Development Office, the Commissioner Environmental Protection, 4 representatives of the Regional Planning Commissions and 4 representatives the general public chosen to represent a broad range of interests and geographic areas. The commission shall select a chairman from its membership.

The commission shall conduct a study of the relationship between the rapid growth in land use pressures within the State and the tools and mechanisms available for communities to manage that growth.

The commission may also request staff support from the State Planning Office, the State Development Office and the Department of Environmental Protection. These offices and the department shall provide assistance if so requested. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall provide assistance in the administration of commission members' compensation and expenses, personnel payroll and benefits.
	14 15 16 17	Sec. 3. Report. The commission shall report its findings and recommendations to the Second Regular Session of the 113th Legislature by February 15, 1988.
