1 AN ACT to Clarify Residency Requirements for
2 Servicemen.

4 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
5 follows:

6 12 MRSA §7076, sub-§6, as amended by PL 1985, c.
7 369, §4, is further amended to read:

8 6. Armed Forces domiciled in Maine. A combina-
9 tion fishing and hunting license shall be issued upon
10 payment of \$11 in 1985, \$13 in 1986 and \$15 in 1987
11 and thereafter, plus the issuing fee, to a Maine
12 resident serviceman on active duty in the Armed
13 Forces of the United States who is permanently sta-
14 tioned outside of the State, his spouse and children.

1 provided that he can show proof that his home of
2 record is Maine. These persons shall be issued all
3 other licenses or permits at resident fees. The li-
4 cense will be valid during the year of issue.

5 STATEMENT OF FACT

6 This new draft clarifies the requirement for a
7 serviceman stationed outside of Maine to purchase
8 combination fishing and hunting licenses at a reduced
9 rate.

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
