16	Further amend the bill in that part designated
17	"§806-A." in the 2nd paragraph by striking out all of

33	costs cannot be determined at this time, the amount
34 35	of liability would be limited to a maximum of \$500 in

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1026, L.D. 1384

1 STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment limits the recovery possible under the bill to a maximum of \$500. It also clarifies that any law enforcement agency, whether local or state, may be found liable under the bill and prevents any further legal action against the law enforcement officer, the State or a political subdivision of the State based on the same facts for which the defendant obtains reimbursement under the bill. Finally, the amendment adds a fiscal note to the bill.
