Any existing posted signs 2 do not conform to the provisions of this para-3 graph and which were erected prior to the effec-4 tive date of this paragraph shall be deemed to be valid for enforcement purposes. 5 Any vehicle 6 parked in a clearly marked parking space designated by-a-municipality as a handicapped parking space that does not bear a special registration plate or placard issued under Title 29, section 252, or a similar plate issued by another state, 7 8 9 10 11 shall be cited for a penalty not-to-exceed-\$25 of 12 not less than \$50 unless otherwise established by 13 local ordinance. Owners of private off-street 14 parking may shall arrange for private enforcement 15 or shall enter into agreements with local or 16 county law enforcement agencies for the policing of stalls and spaces dedicated for handicapped persons' vehicles, under which agreements unau-17 18 19 thorized vehicles shall be tagged. Where service facilities are established on the Maine Turnpike 20 21 and on the interstate highway system in Maine, the State Police shall enforce this subsection. 22 "Clearly marked" includes painted signs on pave-23 ment, vertical standing signs or barriers, to the extent possible, visible in all weather condi-24 25 26 tions. Under such agreements public law enforcement of-ficials may exercise their vested authority to 27 28 29 ensure that parking spaces designated for the handicapped are utilized appropriately by handi-30 31

capped persons, irrespective of whether the designated handicapped parking spaces are located on 32 33 public or private lots open to the public.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 458, L.D. 1402

1 STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment changes the number 20 to 25 parking spaces, one of which would be designated a handicapped persons' parking space. Spaces shall be clearly marked and visible. The fine shall be \$50 for each offense, not only the first offense. The amendment requires owners of private lots to arrange for enforcement by private means or public agencies.
