IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD  
NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Make the Director of Safety a  
Major Policy-influencing Position.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as  
follows:

5 MRSA §948, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 729, §4,  
is amended to read:

§948. Department of Public Safety

1. Major policy-influencing positions. The fol-  
lowing positions are major policy-influencing posi-  
tions within the Department of Public Safety. Not-  
withstanding any other provision of law, these posi-  
tions and their successor positions shall be subject  
to this chapter:

- 1 A. Chief, Bureau of State Police;  
2 B. Director, Bureau of Liquor Enforcement;  
3 C. Director, Office of State Fire Marshal;  
4 D. Director, Maine Criminal Justice Academy;  
5 E. Assistant to the Commissioner for Public In-  
6 formation;  
7 F. Assistant to the Commissioner; and  
8 G. Two Deputy Chiefs, Bureau of State Police;  
9 and  
10 H. Director, Bureau of Safety.

11 STATEMENT OF FACT

12 This bill amends the Maine Revised Statutes, Ti-  
13 tle 5, section 948, to place the Director of Safety  
14 within the category of major policy-influencing posi-  
15 tions within the Department of Public Safety.
