The fee for such search and copy shall be-\$27-payable-in |

advance reasonably reflect the cost of the service, as specified in section 9, subsection 1.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 2804, enacted in 1967, set the fee for a certified copy of a divorce report at \$2. This amount does not cover the cost of searching for the desired record and preparing a properly certified copy once the correct record is located, nor the cost of filing, editing, computerizing and indexing the records after they are prepared and submitted by the clerks of court. The current fee for certified copies of other vital records is \$5; the amount is determined by periodic reviews in accordance with Title 22, section 9, which gives the department authority to charge fees which reasonably cover the costs of providing requested services.

This bill deletes the inclusion of the specified fee in Title 22, section 2804, and substitutes a reference to Title 22, section 9, subsection 1.
