The Maine Volunteer Lawyers' 8 Project has been acting as a clearinghouse, 9 persons with legal needs with lawyers willing to as-10 Typical matters requiring legal aid sist them. clude evictions, divorce, child custody, bankruptcy 11 12 and defense of civil liability suits. The Maine and 13 Federal Bar Associations have a long history of doing 14 pro bono work. This bill spreads this growing urgent 15 responsibility over the whole Maine bar membership by 16 requiring each private practice lawyer to take one 17 pro bono case to be relicensed annually.
