	6 7 8	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and					
	9 10	Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until the end of the summer; and					
<u> </u>	11 12 13	Whereas, aquaculture operations are already required to be licensed by the Department of Marine Resources; and					

1 2 3 4	Whereas, the Department of Environmental Protection has received and continues to receive numerous applications from aquaculture operators for the licensing of activities that are more appropriately regulated by the Department of Marine Resources; and
6 7 8	Whereas, delays experienced by those applicants for waste water discharge licenses would constitute an undue hardship on aquaculture businesses; and
9 10 11 12 13	Whereas, review by the Department of Environmental Protection on any applications for the licensing of aquaculture operations received by the Department of Marine Resources assures that water quality protective measures will be fully considered; and
14 15 16 17 18	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
20 21	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
22	38 MRSA §413, sub-§2-E is enacted to read:
23 24 25 26	2-E. Exemption; aquaculture. No person may be deemed in violation of this section for the discharge of food and medicinal substances for the purpose of marine aquaculture, if:
27 28 29	A. The appropriate leaseholds for marine and estuarine waters have been obtained from the Department of Marine Resources; and
30 31 32 33 34 35	B. The Department of Environmental Protection certifies that the aquaculture activities mentioned in this subsection will not have a significant adverse effect on water quality or violate the standards ascribed to the receiving waters' classifications.
36 37 - 38	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

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purpose of this bill is to avoid a dual license requirement by the Department of Environmental Protection and the Department of Marine Resources on owners of marine aquaculture businesses while still allowing for protection of the waters of the State. Under the bill, those aquaculture operations will exempt from the need to obtain a waste water discharge license for certain activities from the partment of Environmental Protection. The Department Environmental Protection will review applications for the Department of Marine Resources' aquaculture leases and issue water quality certificates to those that will not significantly impair water quality prevent the receiving waters from attaining their

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designated classifications.
