## STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to give the Department of Environmental Protection the authority to regulate the transportation of special waste through a system of licensing, vehicle markings and designation hauling routes. The specific objective of this bill is to ensure that the movement of the more dangerous categories of special waste be restricted to designated routes with checkpoints so as to improve enforcement and to minimize risk to the general public.

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
