AN ACT to Authorize Evaluation of Vital Statistics.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 22 MRSA \$2701, sub-\$2 is amended to read:

2. <u>Supervision</u>. The state registrar shall have charge of the Office of Vital Statistics and be custodian of its files and records. He shall preserve all certificates, records and other reports returned to him under this Title. He shall have general supervision of this Title and the regulations of the department relating to the registration of vital statistics7-and-shall-direct-the-activities-of-municipal clerks-in-the-registration-of-vital--statistics. He

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shall direct, supervise and control the activities of all persons when they are engaged in activities per-1 2 3 taining to the operation of the system of vital sta-4 He shall conduct training programs to protistics. mote uniformity of policy and procedures throughout 5 State in matters pertaining to the system of viб the 7 tal statistics. He shall monitor the accuracy, completeness and validity of all information returned to 8 him under this Title. 9

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Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §2702-A is enacted to read:

11 §2702-A. Duties to furnish information

12 Any person having knowledge of the facts shall 13 furnish such information as he may possess regarding 14 any birth, death, spontaneous fetal death, abortion, 15 marriage, divorce or annulment, upon demand of the 16 state registrar.

The accuracy of the and 22 information contained on vital records is key to all of these purposes. Penalties are prescribed by law for the provision of false information. Past efforts 23 24 25 to evaluate these records have been seriously flawed 26 by refusals to participate.

27 bill clarifies the responsibility of the This 28 state registrar to operate the vital statistics svstem in this State, as set forth in the Maine Revised 29 Statutes, Title 22, sections 2701 and 2709, to 30 include maintenance of its quality and validity. 31 This bill authorizes the Office of Vital Statistics to re-32 quire the individuals, institutions or facilities who 33 34 are charged with reporting or filing vital statistics records to participate in evaluation studies for the 35 purpose of assessing their accuracy and validity and 36 identifying aspects needing improvement. 37

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
