AN ACT to Clarify Abrogation of Confidentiality of Communicable Disease Information for Child and Adult Protection Purposes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

22 MRSA §1032, as amended by PL 1985, c. 771, §4, is further amended to read:

§1032. Confidentiality

The names and related information which may identify individuals having or suspected of having a notifiable communicable disease shall be confidential and may be released only to other public health offi-

15 cials, agents or agencies, or to school officials

STATEMENT OF FACT

Reporting by medical or social service workers of suspected child abuse or neglect is required by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 4011 and of suspected adult abuse or neglect by Title 22, section 3477.

Adding reference to child and adult protection to Title 22, section 1032, clarifies this abrogation of confidentiality by professionals employed by the Department of Human Services, Bureau of Health, Division of Disease Control, including Sexually Transmitted Disease Control.
