#### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Update References to Immunities of State Military Forces under the State Tort Claims Act.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 14 MRSA §8102, sub-\$1, as amended by PL 1977, c. 696, \$165, is further amended to read:

1. Employee. "Employee" means a person acting on behalf of the governmental entity in any official capacity, whether temporarily or permanently, and whether with or without compensation from local, state or federal funds, including elected or appointed officials, volunteer firefighters as defined in Title 30, section 3771, rescue squad members where the rescue squad receives full or partial financial

support from political subdivisions, Maine National Guardsmen while in-active-state-service--under--Title 37-A7-sections-57-and-207 receiving state active duty pay under Title 37-B, section 143, in accordance with Title 37-B, sections 181 to 183 and 742, and while engaged in the Domestic Action Program, but the term "employee" shall not mean a person or other legal en-tity acting in the capacity of an independent con-tractor under contract to the governmental entity.

 Sec. 2. 14 MRSA \$8103, sub-\$2, \$E, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 578, \$1, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

E. The activities of the state military forces when receiving state active duty pay under Title 37-B, section 143, in accordance with Title 37-B, sections 181 and 182, intervention in insurrections, and Title 37-B, section 183, human health care emergency assistance.

### STATEMENT OF FACT

Presently, the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 14, section 8102, defines a Maine National Guardsman as being "in active state service under Title 37-B, sections 57 and 207." Presently, Title 14, section 8103, subsection 2, paragraph E, similarly grants immunity from the operation of the Maine Tort Claims Act for "activities of the Maine National Guard when engaged in combatant activities during a time of war, or when called to duty in accordance with a proclamation of emergency by the Governor in accordance with Title 37-A, section 57 or 207."

A change in terminology is necessary to correct the misnomer "Maine National Guard" in favor of "state military forces." State military forces is the status of the Maine National Guard called to emergency state active duty by the Governor. State military forces also include Maine Militia and Maine Air National Guard (in state active duty) where applicable, as further defined in Title 37-B, section 102-A.
