9 10	5-A. Informed consent. "Informed consent" means consent that is:
11 12 13 14 15	A. Based upon an actual understanding by the person to be tested of the nature of the test, the persons to whom the results of that test may be disclosed, the purpose for which the test results may be used and all reasonably forseeable

2	B. Wholly voluntary and free from express or implied coercion.
4	Sec. 2. 5 MRSA \$17003-A is enacted to read:
5	§17003-A. Informed consent required
6 7 8 9	Except as provided in section 17003, subsection 4, no person may test for the presence of antibodies to HTLV-III without first obtaining the informed consent of the person to be tested.
10	STATEMENT OF FACT
11 12 13 14 15 16 17 18 19 20	This bill will provide the advantage of a full understanding of the HIV antibody test to those persons who have endeavored to learn their HTLV-III antibody status. This bill also protects individuals from being tested for antibodies to HTLV-III without their knowledge. This bill continues the exemption from the requirement for consent from organ donees contained in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 17003, subsection 4. This bill was endorsed by the Maine State AIDS Advisory Committee.

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
