This new draft replaces the original bill. The present law allows teachers who have taught in public schools for 10 years and who previously had taught in a parochial or private school to purchase up to 10 years of service credit in the Maine State Retirement System for the years they taught in the private or parochial school. The teacher pays the full actuarial cost of the benefit for the additional years and there is no cost to the State.

This new draft repeals the section of law which states that the teacher must have started teaching in public schools before January 1, 1976, and began payments as of that date or within 30 days of becoming eligible. This new draft has no cost to the State or local school units. The total cost is paid by the teacher purchasing the service credit.
