1 **AN ACT to Make Allocations from Various Funds**
2 **of the Department of Environmental**
3 **Protection for the Fiscal Years Ending**
4 **June 30, 1988, and June 30, 1989.**

6 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legis-
7 lature do not become effective until 90 days after
8 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

9 Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate un-
10 til after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

11 Whereas, certain obligations and expenses inci-
12 dent to the operation of the department will become
13 due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1987;
14 and

1 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature,
2 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of
3 the Constitution of Maine and require the following
4 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-
5 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
6 therefore,

7 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
8 follows:

9 **Sec. 1. Allocation of Ground Water Oil Clean-up**
10 **Fund.** Income to the Ground Water Oil Clean-up Fund
11 for the next 2 fiscal years ending June 30, 1988, and
12 June 30, 1989, shall be segregated, apportioned and
13 disbursed as designated in the following schedule:
