5	may order into active service of the State or in aid
6	of any civil authority the necessary personnel and

2	emergencies may include medical evacuation and search
3	and rescue under Title 6, section 303 and Title 12,
4	section 7035. Any person ordered into active service
5	of the State, for the purposes of this subsection,
6	shall be considered a state employee for purposes of
7	the Maine Tort Claims Act and his liability shall be
8	limited by that Act

STATEMENT OF FACT

The present Maine Revised Statutes, Title 11 section 183, subsection 1, allows the activation of 12 the state military forces, i.e. National Guard, the event of an emergency arising out of illness or 13 14 injury. The law does not specifically provide 15 the location of missing persons and the prevention of 16 loss of life or intercession in situations producing 17 an increased health risk to individuals and their 18 communities. The new provision allows for the Gover-19 approval of National Guard activities such as medical evacuation and search and rescue.

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
