| 9 10 11 | The creation of job opportunities for Maine citizens is one of the highest priorities to maintain a healthy and balanced economy. Certain parts of the |

do not enjoy the same level of economic devel-

opment as other areas. Differences in geographical location, variations in the amount of natural or built resources and population, among other factors, have an impact on the ability of these areas to compete in a global economy and expand job opportunities.

Recognizing the need to assist certain areas of the State to address this economic disparity, it is appropriate to establish a program of economic development incentives targeted to areas of the State which are not sharing in the economic growth or job opportunities associated with that growth.

The responsibility for enhancing the development potential of any area must be a partnership between the locality and the State to create a local strategy, build capacity, improve infrastructure and services, identify and provide appropriate development incentives and effectively market and promote the community.

§15131. Purpose

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Job opportunity zones are created to enhance the partnership between the State and areas which are found to be economically distressed or impacted by sudden or severe dislocation of the economy. By targeting state and local resources and selected incentives, within the context of a local economic development strategy, job opportunity zones can be an

effective tool to encourage balanced economic growth.

§15132. Definitions

As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.

1. Director. "Director" means the Director of the State Development Office.

3. Zone. "Zone" means a job opportunity zone.

1 §15133. Designation of job opportunity zones

The director may establish 4 demonstration zones in economically distressed areas of the State as a means of determining the effectiveness of such zones as a tool for stimulating economic growth and development.

- 7 l. Standards for zones. The director, by rules
 8 adopted in accordance with the Maine Administrative
 9 Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, shall establish
 10 standards for the selection of areas to be designated
 11 as zones. At a minimum, the director shall apply the
 12 following standards.
- 13 A. All zones shall be economically distressed 14 areas as determined by the director. At a minimum, the definition of distress shall include an unemployment rate, in the areas to be designated, 15 16 17 of at least 1.5 times greater than the unemployment rate for the State, as reported by the Department of Labor or wherein the per capita income in the area to be designated is less than 18 19 20 21 of the per capita income of the State, where there is a significant decline in the population 22 23 where there is a significant decline in the 24 labor force as reported by the Department of 25 bor.
- B. All areas wishing to be designated as zones will demonstrate local capacity for economic development, including an active local economic development organization and a comprehensive local economic development strategy.
- C. At least one zone shall be a sudden or severely economically distressed area which has experienced significant layoffs.
- D. At least one zone shall be an urban zone, comprising all or part of a municipality with a population greater than 10,000.
 - E. At least one zone shall be a rural zone, comprising a municipality of a collection of contiquous municipalities, no one zone having a population greater than 10,000.

- A. Giving priority status in the allocation of available resources as a part of the community industrial buildings program;
- B. Upon request, providing appropriate technical assistance to firms and industries locating within zones with respect to the completion of applications for state licenses and permits;
- 28 C. Providing technical assistance to local and regional economic and community development agencies serving the zone in determining approaches and identifying resources which may promote economic growth;
- D. Focusing technical assistance and marketing resources to support the business retention, expansion and recruitment activities within the zone; and

Developing and implementing a grants program for projects within the zones, utilizing such money as may be appropriated by the Legislature for the purpose of encouraging economic development within job opportunity zones. 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- §5217. Credit for equity investment in job opportunity zones
- Credit. A resident individual, resident tate or trust or taxable corporation is entitled to a credit against the tax otherwise due under this Part equal to 50% of the amount of the investment in a business operating within a job opportunity zone as designated according to Title 5, chapter 403. Twenty percent of the credit shall be taken in the taxable of the investment and 20% in each of the next 4taxable years. The credit allowed under this section shall be available to a resident individual, resident estate or trust or taxable corporation to a maximum of \$50,000 for each business investment. The investment allowed under this section shall be available to maximum of \$500,000 annually and shall be distributed among the job opportunity zones according procedures established by the State Development Office.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill authorizes the creation of 4 demonstration job opportunity zones to be designated and administered by the State Development Office. Job opportunity zones are areas of the State which are economically distressed and are designated to receive targeted resources, as well as providing additional incentives to businesses to create new employment opportunities.

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
