AN ACT Relating to the Definition of

Full-time Corrections Officer.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
<pre>25 MRSA §2805, sub-§2, %C, as amended by PL 1983, c. 67, §2, is further amended to read:</pre>
C. "Full-time corrections officer" means employ- ment with the reasonable expectation of earning at-least-\$6,7000 completing at least 1,400 hours on duty in any one calendar or fiscal year for performing corrections officer duties. "Correc- tions officer" means as follows:

1	(1) For state agencies, the following class
2	titles and their successor titles: Training
3	School Counselor I and II; Training School
4	Counselor Supervisor; Corrections Officer I,
5	II and III; Guard; Guard Sergeant; Guard
6	Lieutenant and Guard Captain; and
7 8	(2) For county, municipal and other agencies subject to this chapter, the Maine
9	Criminal Justice Academy shall define the
10	term "corrections officer."

STATEMENT OF FACT

LZ	The Maine Revised Statutes, Title 25, Section
13.	2805, defines a part-time correctional officer as a
L4	person who expects to earn less than \$6,000 in any
15	year. The problem as this law presently exists is
16	the higher paying counties are getting fewer hours
17	from their part-time staff than those who are paying
18	a lower rate. It is the intent of this bill to cor-
19	rect that situation.
