Resolve, to Authorize the Commissioner of

7 8 9 10	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
11 12 13 14	Whereas, The Commissioner of Mental Health and Mental Retardation has appointed Charles E. Meredith, M.D., a commissioned officer in the United States Public Health Service, as Superintendent of the Bangor Mental Health Institute: and

1 Whereas, the greater Bangor area and the Bangor 2 Mental Health Institute specifically have been de-3 clared to be areas in which a psychiatric manpower 4 shortage exists according to the requirements of the 5 United States Department of Health and Human Services 6 and the United States Public Health Service; and

Whereas, the Bangor Mental Health Institute as one of the State's major psychiatric service facilities is in need of additional psychiatric manpower; and

Whereas, Senator William Cohen and Senator George Mitchell, Maine's 2 United States Senators, directly intervened on Maine's behalf with the United States Public Health Service to effectuate the assignment of Dr. Meredith to Maine; and

Whereas, the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 3003, limits the time period for interchange of governmental employees to 12 out of any 36-month period; and

Whereas, the Commissioner of Mental Health and Mental Retardation wishes to appoint Charles E. Meredith, M.D., for a period to exceed 12 months; and

Whereas, the 12-month period of Charles E. Meredith's appointment as Superintendent of the Bangor Mental Health Institute will terminate on July 8, 1987; and

Whereas, it is vital for the position of the Superintendent of the Bangor Mental Health Institute to continue to be filled by Charles E. Meredith, M.D., after July 8, 1987; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Commissioner of Mental Health and Mental Retardation authorized. Resolved: That, nothwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 3003,

the Commissioner of Mental Health and Mental Retarda-2 is authorized to appoint Charles E. Meredith, 3 M.D., as Superintendent of the Bangor Mental Health 4 Institute for a period to exceed 12 months.

STATEMENT OF FACT

9 Charles E. Meredith, M.D., a Board Certified Psy-10 chiatrist, licensed to practice in the State and active duty commissioned officer in the United States 11 12 Public Health Service Corps as an employee of the 13 Federal Government has been assigned to Maine at 14 request and was appointed by the Commissioner of Men-15 Health and Mental Retardation to act as Superin-16 tendent of the Bangor Mental Health Institute on July 17 8, 1986, after an extensive search which commenced on 18 May 24, 1985. Dr. Meredith brings not only ample ad-19 ministrative experience, but also represents addipsychiatric manpower to the hospital. Penobscot County and Bangor Mental Health Institute were designated by the Federal Government at Maine's request as a health manpower shortage area, specifically in psychiatry. Dr. Meredith was the successful candidate after a wide recruitment process, several lengthy interviews and extensive reference checking and was assigned to Maine by the United States Pub-lic Health Service Corps after Maine requested a psychiatrist with lengthy leadership and administrative experience be assigned to assist the State.

Meredith has been assigned to Maine by the United States Public Health Service Corps on tract basis and serves at the pleasure of the Commisof Mental Health and Mental Retardation. sioner remains a federal employee assigned to Maine. Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 3003, however, prohibits the interchange of governmental employees in excess of 12 months during any 36-month peri-In order for Dr. Meredith as a United States Public Health Service Corps employee to continue to serve as the Superintendent of the Bangor

Health Institute, which is desired by the department, the Legislature must override the 12-month limitation which ends on July 8, 1987. 1 2 3
