The members appointed by the commissioner shall represent a geographical distribution within the region.

STATEMENT OF FACT

10 Penobscot, Hancock, Piscataquis and Washington 11 Counties presently have grossly inadequate crisis intervention services available for mentally ill per-12 There are limited sources of contact with men-13 sons. 14 tal health professionals from 5 p.m. to 9 a.m. and on 15 weekends and holidays in that area. The Bangor 16 Health Institute is grossly overextended and is geographically difficult to reach for many 17 in 18 No emergency room in the catchment 4-county area. 19 area has a psychiatrist, psychologist or social work-20 er on duty in the emergency room.

When urgent mental health needs are not responded to by timely and appropriate interventions, situations escalate resulting in a proportionate increase of suicide, substance abuse, child abuse and neglect, domestic violence and homelessness. Timely crisis intervention may result in substantial savings to public expenditures and a significant reduction in human suffering.

This bill establishes the Crisis Intervention Program for Penobscot, Hancock, Piscataquis and Washington Counties. The program will deliver crisis intervention services through a hospital-based program, an outreach program and a telephone hot-line. An advisory board is also created to provide oversight, planning and fund-raising activities.

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
