5	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis-
6	lature do not become effective until 90 days after
7	adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
8 9 10 11 12	Whereas, according to the provisions of Public Law 1985, chapter 695, the transition of the vocational-technical institutes to the Maine Vocational-Technical Institute System must be completed by June 30, 1987; and
13	Whereas, although great strides toward the com-
14	plete transition have been made, the transition can-
15	not be finalized within the established deadline:

- Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
- 7 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- 9 Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §12701, sub-§7, as enacted by 10 PL 1985, c. 695, §11, is amended to read:
- 7. Maine Vocational-Technical Institute System
 Office. "Maine Vocational-Technical Institute Support
 System Office" means the office of the executive director, together with the offices of supporting staff, as established in section 12710.
- 18 1. Membership. The board of trustees shall con-19 sist of 9 appointed voting members and 2 ex officio, 20 nonvoting voting members as follows:
- 21 A. One from the State Board of Education;
- B. One from the Board of Trustees of the University of Maine;
- 24 C. Seven from the field of business and indus-25 try, the field of labor, the field of education 26 and the general public;
- D. The Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services, or his successor, who shall serve ex officio; and
- 30 E. The Director of the State Development Office, 31 or his successor, who shall serve ex officio.
- 7. Quorum. A quorum shall consist of a majority
 33 of the members of the board of trustees. No action
- 34 may be taken without the affirmative vote of 5
 35 appointed members present and voting.

Sec. 3. 20-A MRSA §12706, sub-§§1, 10 and 19 as
enacted by PL 1985, c. 695, §11, are amended to read:

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- 1. Policies. To develop and adopt policies for the operation of the system, the Maine Vocational-Technical Institute Support System Office and the institutes; establish the administrative council; and approve programs and policies recommended by the executive director and the administrative council;
- 9 10. Legal affairs. To sue and be sued in its own name. Services of process in any action shall be made by service upon the executive director, either in hand or by leaving a copy of the process at the Maine Vocational-Technical Institute Support System Office;
- 14 Advisory committees. To appoint or identify advisory committees to advise the board of 15 with respect to vocational and technical education 16 17 and training policies and programs, to procedures for 18 modifying the programs of the institutes to meet 19 needs of the State's economy and the changing job 20 market and to the efficient operation of the 21 and the Maine Vocational-Technical Institute Support System Office. These committees may include, 22 but need not be limited to, the Maine Council on Vo-23 24 cational Education, authorized under the 25 States Carl D. Perkins Vocational Education Act, Sec-26 tion 112, Public Law 98-524, or its successor.
- 27 Sec. 4. 20-A MRSA §12709, sub-§§2, 4, 5 and 8, 28 as enacted by PL 1985, c. 695, §11, are amended to read:
- 2. Maine Vocational-Technical Institute System
 Office staff appointment. Under procedures and standards developed by the board of trustees, to appoint
 the staff of the Maine Vocational-Technical Institute
 Support System Office, including professional and
 nonprofessional personnel and including, but not limited to, private legal counsel and financial experts;
 - 4. <u>Staff oversight.</u> To oversee the staff of the <u>Maine</u> Vocational-Technical Institute Support <u>System</u> Office and the directors of the institutes;

5. Personnel evaluation. Under policies and standards developed by the board of trustees, to evaluate the performance of the Maine Vocational-Technical Institute Support System Office staff and of the directors of the institutes and to make personnel recommendations to the board of trustees;

 for an accounting system and procedures which will
 reflect and identify all appropriations, allocations,
 income and revenues and all expenditures of each institute and the Maine Vocational-Technical Institute
 Support System Office;

- The <u>Maine Vocational-Technical Institute Support</u>

 System Office shall implement the policies of the
 board of trustees and shall provide staff and technical assistance to each institute and state-level coordination and leadership to the system.

- 3. Nomination of assistant directors. The director of each institute shall nominate an assistant director, deans and director-of-finance assistant director of administrative services for appointment by the board of trustees.
- 31 A. The Board of Trustees of the Maine Vocation-32 al-Technical Institute System shall may use the 33 Office of Employee Relations for the purposes of 34 this chapter. This--paragraph-shall-be-repeated 35 June-307-1987.

8 9 10 11 12 13	The organization of the Maine Vocational-Technical Institute System Office shall be accomplished in orderly stages and shall be completed on or before July 1, 1988. The Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government shall review the Maine Vocational-Technical Institute's transition implementation.
14 15 16 17 18	Sec. 10. Carry forward. The General Fund appropriations for the Maine Vocational-Technical Institute System and individual vocational-technical institutes shall carry forward to fiscal years 1988 and 1989 to be used for the same purposes.
19 20 21	Sec. 11. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
