AN ACT to Clarify the Organizational Status of the Bureau of Lottery within the Department of Finance.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 8 MRSA c. 14, as amended, is repealed.

Sec. 2. 8 MRSA c. 14-A is enacted to read:

Any va-cancy occurring in the office of the director shall 30 31 32 be filled in the same manner as the original appoint-33 ment. 24 25 26 B. Act as the chief administrative officer, having general charge of the office and records and to employ such personnel as may be necessary to fulfill the purposes of this chapter. The personnel shall be employed with the approval of the commissioner and subject to the Civil Service Law, except for the deputy director who shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the director;

C. Act as executive secretary of the commission;

D. In accordance with this chapter and the rules promulgated under this chapter, license as agents to sell lottery tickets such persons who, in his opinion, will best serve the public convenience and promote the sale of tickets or shares. The director may require a bond from every licensed agent in such amount as provided by rule. Every licensed agent shall prominently display his license, or a copy of his license, as provided by rule;

E. Confer regularly as necessary or desirable and not less than once each month with the commissioner on the operation and administration of the lotteries; make available for inspection by commissioner, upon request, all the books, records, files and other information docuand ments of the commission; advise the commissioner and recommend such matters as he deems necessary and advisable to improve the operation and administration of the lotteries;

F. Recommend to the commission that it suspend or revoke, in accordance with section 376-A, any license issued pursuant to this chapter or the rules promulgated under this chapter;

G. Subject to the approval of the commissioner and to any applicable laws relating to public contracts, enter into contracts for the operation of the lotteries, or any part of the lotteries,

The apportionment of the total annual revenue accruing from the sale of lottery tickets or shares and from all other sources for the payment of prizes to the holders of winning tickets or shares; for the payment of costs incurred in the operation and administration of the lotteries, including the expenses of the commission and the costs resulting from any contract or contracts entered into for promotional, advertising, consulting or operational services or for the purchase or lease of lottery equipment and materials; for the repayment of the money appropriated to the State Lottery Fund; and for transfer to the General Fund for distribution pursuant to section 387.

19 2. Meeting requirements. No action of the commission is binding unless taken at a meeting at which 20 at least 3 of the 5 members are present and vote in 21 favor of the action. The minutes of every meeting of 22 23 the commission, including any rules promulgated by the commission or any amendments, revisions, supple-24 25 ments or repeals, shall be immediately transmitted, 26 by and under the certification of the secretary, to 27 the commissioner for his approval or disapproval and 28 to the Governor.

29 3. Limintation of authority. The commission and 30 the bureau shall have no authority to regulate, con-31 trol or otherwise supervise the operation or conduct 32 of the amusement commonly known as "beano" or 33 "bingo," as defined in Title 17, section 311.

§376. Suspension and revocation of licenses

1. The commission may suspend or revoke, after notice and hearing, any license issued pursuant to this chapter. The license may be temporarily suspended by the commission without prior notice, pending any prosecution, investigation or hearing. A license may be suspended or revoked by the commission for just cause, including one or more of the following reasons:

A. Failure to account for tickets received or the proceeds of the sale of tickets or to file a bond, if required by the commission, or to comply with instructions of the commission concerning the licensed activity;

B. Conviction of any criminal offense;

C. Failure to file any return or report, to keep records or to pay any tax;

D. Engaging in fraud, deceit, misrepresentation or conduct prejudicial to public confidence;

E. Insufficiency of the number of tickets sold by the sales agent; or

F. A material change, since issuance of the license, with respect to any of the matters required to be considered by the director under section 375.

2. Suspension; state license. Except in the case of suspension or revocation for the reasons set forth in section 412, subsection 1, paragraph E or F, any suspension or revocation of a tri-state license issued under chapter 16 shall automatically result in suspension of the state license.

5 §378. Assignment of prizes

No right of any person to a prize drawn may 6 be 7 assignable, except that payment of any prize drawn 8 may be paid to the estate of a deceased prize winner, and except that any person pursuant to an appropriate 9 10 judicial order may be paid the prize to which the winner is entitled. The bureau shall be discharged 11 12 of all further liability upon payment of a prize pursuant to this section. 13

16 No person may sell a ticket or share at a price greater than that fixed by rule of the commission.

25 §380. Sales to persons under 18 years; gifts

26 No ticket or share may be sold to any person under the age of 18 years, but this shall not be deemed 27 28 to prohibit the purchase of a ticket or share for the 29 purpose of making a gift by a person 18 years of age or older to a person less than that age. Any licens-ee who knowingly sells or offers to sell a lottery 30 31 32 ticket or share to any person under the age of 18 commits a civil violation for which a forfeiture of 33 34 not more than \$200 may be adjudged.

35 §381. Persons prohibited from purchasing tickets or 36 shares

No ticket or share may be purchased by, and no prize may be paid to, any of the following persons: Any officer or employee of the commission or bureau or any spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the prin-cipal place of abode of any of these persons.

Unclaimed prize money for the prize on a winning ticket or share shall be retained by the director for the person entitled to it for one year after the drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made for the money within that year, the prize money shall be reallocated as prizes in the form of special promotions.

§383. Deposit of receipts; reports

The director may require any lottery sales agents to deposit to the credit of the State Lottery Fund in banks designated by the Treasurer of State all money received by the agents from the sale of lottery tick-ets or shares, less the amount, if any, retained as compensation for the sale of tickets or shares and to file with the director or his designated agents reports of their receipts and transactions in the sale of lottery tickets in such form and containing such information as he may require. The director may make such arrangements for any person, including a bank, to perform the functions, activities or services in connection with the operation of the lottery as he may deem advisable pursuant to this chapter and the rules of the commission and those functions, activiservices shall constitute lawful functions, ties or activities and services of that person.
