2 Sec. 4. Allowance for state administration pur-3 poses. An allowance for the use of funds allotted in 4 this Act, not to exceed 5% of the funds allocated to 5 each agency, shall be available to each of the agen-6 cies funded under this Act.

7 Sec. 5. Unexpended balances carried forward. 8 Any unexpended balances of allocations made from this 9 fund on June 30, 1988, shall not lapse, but shall 10 carry through June 30, 1989, to be used for the same purposes. The Governor, through the Office of Energy Resources, shall report annually to the Legislature, 11 12 13 beginning on December 1, 1987, as to the progress on the expenditures of funds and to recommendations for 14 15 the reallocation of funds.
