AN ACT to Provide Funds to Local School
Administrative Units and to the
Department of Educational and Cultural
Services to Implement and Meet the
Requirements of the Teacher and
Administrator Certification Laws.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the lllth and ll2th Legislatures enacted 3 major laws that directly affected the preparation and certification of educational personnel employed in the State's schools; and

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1 2 3	Whereas, the implementation of these laws creates an increased work load and fiscal expenditures at both the local and state levels; and
4 5 6 7	Whereas, the local school administrative units and the Department of Educational and Cultural Services need to begin the implementation of these laws immediately; and
8 9 10 11 12	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

13 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited 14 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when ap-15 proved.

## 16 STATEMENT OF FACT

The 111th and 112th Legislatures enacted 3 major laws that directly affected the preparation and certification of educational personnel employed in the States's schools.

- 1. Public Law 1983, chapter 859 mandated several education reforms and improvements, including qualifying exams for the certification of beginning teachers.
- 25 2. The teacher certification law upgraded and 26 strengthened the requirements for teacher certification in the State.
- 28 3. The school administrator certification law 29 upgraded requirements for principals and superintend-30 ents to be certified.

The first provision of this bill appropriates the necessary funds, in the next fiscal year, to local school administrative units to implement the laws by paying for planning, teacher and administrator training, coordination, substitute teachers, stipends and clerical backup. The funds would be distributed to

2 3 4 5	at the rate of \$100 per teacher and \$250 per administrator for the first year and at the rate of \$100 per teacher and \$100 per administrator in subsequent years.
6 7 8 9 10 11 12	The 2nd provision of this bill appropriates the necessary funds for the Department of Educational and Cultural Services to employ additional staff to implement and monitor the new certification laws and provide the technical assistance to local school administrative units to develop plans for initial and renewal certification plans as well as teacher development and improvement plans.

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
