## STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

## AN ACT to Enhance the Certification of Educational Personnel Law.

4 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 5 follows:

Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA \$13011, sub-\$1, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 845, \$4, is amended to read:

1. Certification and revocation rules. All Except as provided in section 13014, subsection 5, and section 13018, all teacher certificates issued or revoked after June 30, 1988, and all administrator and other professional certificates issued or revoked after June 30, 1989, shall be in accordance with this chapter. The Except as provided in section 13014, subsection 5, the state board shall adopt rules prior to April 1, 1988 to carry out the purposes of this chapter under which the commissioner shall:

Endorsements. The professional level I teach-33 3. 34 certificate shall be issued with an endorsement er 35 which specifies the grades and subject area which the 36 teacher is deemed qualified to teach. A holder of а

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professional <u>level</u> I teacher certificate may not teach outside his or her area of endorsement unless he or she has received a waiver from the commissioner in accordance with state board rules.

4. <u>Five-year certificate</u>. A professional <u>level I</u> teacher certificate shall be issued for a 5-year period and may be renewed in accordance with section 13016.

11 §13014. Professional level II teacher certificate

12 1. Definition. A master professional level II 13 teacher certificate is a renewable certificate issued 14 to an individual who has achieved additional profes-15 sional standards in accordance with this section.

2. <u>Qualifications</u>. State board rules governing the qualifications for a master professional level II teacher certificate shall require that the certificate may only be issued to an applicant who, at a minimum:

> A. Possesses a professional <u>level I</u> teacher certificate;

B. Has demonstrated exemplary professional skills in classroom instruction and who may have additionally contributed to the profession in such areas as:

27 (1) Curriculum development;

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28 (2) Teacher in-service training and effec 29 tive staff development; or

30 (3) Student-teacher supervision; and

C. Has obtained the support system's positive
 recommendation based on the contents of a teacher
 action plan pursuant to section 13015.

34 3. <u>Endorsements</u>. The holder of a master profes-35 sional level II teacher certificate shall possess, at

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1 a minimum, the endorsements held under the profes-2 sional level I certificate.

3 4. Five-year certificate. A master professional 4 level II teacher certificate may be issued for a 5 5-year period and may be renewed in accordance with 6 section 13016.

7 Effective date. Notwithstanding the July 1, 5. 1988, reference in section 13011, the state board 8 9 shall establish as a target date, September-17-1987 10 July 1, 1989, to adopt rules governing the issuance of master professional level II teacher certificates. Following the effective date of these rules, eligible 11 12 13 teachers may apply to qualify for a master profes-14 sional level II teacher certificate. Master Professional level II teacher certificates may be issued 15 16 starting in July 1988 1, 1990.

For the purposes of this paragraph, the state board shall establish by rule the definition of classroom teacher;

B. A description of the duties and responsibilities of the support system in the preparation of
a teacher action plan for both provisional teachers and applicants for master professional level
II teacher certification;

 professional level II teacher responsible for the
 design and coordination of a teacher action plan;

37 Sec. 5. 20-A MRSA \$13015, sub-\$4, as enacted by 38 PL 1983, c. 845, \$4, is amended to read:

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Teacher action plan. A teacher action plan is 4. developed by the support system in consultation with the teacher who is the subject of the plan. The teacher action plan shall describe the specific skills which must be developed and improved by the teacher, as well as any other requirements, which may include additional professional graduate and advanced study, in order to achieve a positive recommendation to receive a higher level of certificate. A teacher action plan shall contain the basis for the positive or negative recommendation of a support system as to whether a teacher should be granted a professional level I teacher certificate or a master professional level II teacher certificate, as applicable.

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15 Sec. 6. 20-A MRSA \$13016, sub-\$\$2 and 3, as en-16 acted by PL 1983, c. 845, \$4, are amended to read:

2. Professional level I teacher certificates. A professional level I teacher certificate may be renewed for 5-year periods in accordance with state board rules which shall require, at a minimum, a recommendation of a support system and that the teacher complete at least 6 hours of professional or academic study, or in-service training designed to improve the performance of the teacher in the field for which the teacher holds an endorsement, or in a related subject area. Teachers who desire to qualify for a master professional level II teacher certificate shall coordinate their continuing professional education with the requirements of an applicable teacher action plan.

3. Professional level II teacher certificate. A master professional level II teacher certificate may renewed for 5-year periods in accordance with be state board rules which shall require, at a minimum, that the master professional level II teacher has obtained a recommendation of the support system that the master professional level II teacher has maintained a high level of professional teacher skills. If the holder of a master professional level II teacher certificate fails to maintain master professional level II teacher skills or chooses not to seek a renewal of the master professional level II teacher certificate, the teacher will be deemed to hold а professional level I teacher certificate and shall meet the requirements for its renewal.

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Notwithstanding any other requirements of this chapter, a teacher, who is eligible to hold a provisional teacher certificate pursuant to an interstate agreement authorized by chapter 511, has at least 2 academic years of prior teacher experience outside the State and has taught for fewer than 2 years in Maine with a provisional teacher certificate, may be awarded a professional <u>level I</u> teacher certificate if recommended by the administrative unit's support system and is otherwise deemed to be eligible by the commissioner.

Administrators who hold certificates issued in accordance with chapter 501 shall continue to hold those certificates until their termination dates. Renewal of administrator certificates issued in accordance with chapter 501 which are granted after the effective date of this Act and before July 1, 1988

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1989, shall be valid for 5 years. All certificates issued after June 30, 1988 1989, shall be issued in accordance with this chapter.

#### §13019-E. Recertification of other professional personnel

Professional personnel other than teachers and administrators who hold certificates issued pursuant to chapter 501 of-this-Title shall continue to hold those certificates until their termination dates. All certificates issued after June 30, 1988 1989, shall be issued and renewed in accordance with rules of the state board adopted pursuant to this chapter.

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16 The state board shall review teacher and adminis-17 trator certificate standards every-6-years annually and report the results of its review to the joint 18 19 standing committee of the Legislature having juris-20 diction over education, along with any proposed leg-The first report to the begislature islation. committee shall be due starting-with-the--legislative session-beginning in December January 1990. In addition to information requested by the committee and other materials deemed relevant by the board, that report shall include an update of rule-making activity accomplished since the last report and an assessment of the use of conditional certificates.

In addition to the 30 report required by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 13021, beginning in 1990, the State Board of Education shall report periodically to the 31 32 33 joint standing committee of the Legislature having ·34 jurisdiction over education as follows:

The Joint Standing Committee on Education shall review the report of the state board, conduct its own review of the professional level II teacher certification concept and issue its report to the Legislature by April 1, 1989.

10 Sec. 13. Funds. The funds to cover the addi-11 tional costs to local school units complying with 12 the teacher and administrator certification law are 13 included in the Governor's budget.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

15 This bill is the minority report of the Joint 16 Standing Committee on Education on its review of the 17 teacher and administrator certification law which is 18 required by Public Law 1983, chapter 845, section 5, 19 and Public Law 1987, chapter 84.

20 The bill:

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21 1. Allows for the completion of the administra-22 tor certification pilot projects currently in opera-23 tion;

24 2. Extends the implementation date for adminis-25 trator certification from July 1, 1988, to July 1, 26 1989;

27 3. Continues the 3 levels of teacher certifica28 tion, but renames the 2nd and 3rd levels professional
29 level I and professional level II;

30 Generally continues July 1, 1988, as the im-4. 31 plementation date for the teacher certification law, 32 but allows teachers whose current certificate expires 33 on July 30, 1988, to renew their certificate under the old law if they wish and provides for a continua-34 35 tion of pilot projects on the 3rd level of certifica-36 tion and for delayed implementation of that level; 37 and

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1 5. Changes the 6-year review and reporting requirement by the State Board of Education on certification issues to an annual one and establishes a series of interim reports on the implementation of the teacher and administrator certification law prior to the first annual report.

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
