14	paragraph, was purchased <u>or issued</u> within

the State, as shown by the records of the the holder;

3 (2) The place of purchase or issue of the
4 instrument, as described in this paragraph,
5 is not shown in the records of the holder
6 and the holder's principal place of business
7 is within the State; or

(3) The place of purchase or issue of the instruments, as described in this paragraph, as shown by the records of the holder, is within a jurisdiction, the laws of which do not provide for the escheat or custodial taking of the property, and the holder's principal place of business is within the State;

STATEMENT OF FACT

17 This bill amends existing law to provide that 18 sums payable on gift certificates, credit vouchers 19 and all similar instruments are property subject to 20 the State's abandoned property laws.
