#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The Maine Job Training Council was established pursuant to Executive Order 9, fiscal year 1982-83. The council was created in order to comply with the Federal Job Training Partnership Act, JTPA, of 1982, Public Law 97-300, as amended, and to receive federal funds supplied under that Act.

Authority to administer the federal program for this State was delegated under Executive Order 9, fiscal year 1982-83, to the Commissioner of Labor. Specific statutory provisions dealing with administration of the Federal Job Training Partnership Act are supplied under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 26, section 2001. Pursuant to Public Law 1983, chapter 650, the Commissioner of Labor was authorized to appoint various personnel to serve at his pleasure, including the Director of the Maine Job Training

Pursuant to Executive Order 16, fiscal year 1986-87, of May 15, 1987, the Maine Job Training Council shall be replaced by the Maine Human Resource Development Council on or before July 1, 1987. Such Executive Order provides that all members of the Hu-

1 2 3	man Resource Development Council, including the chairman of the council, shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor.
4 5 6 7 8 9 10	This bill amends the duties of the Commissioner of Labor as provided in Title 26, section 1401 to reflect the rescission of Executive Order 9, fiscal year 1982-83, and the concomitant replacement of the Maine Job Training Council by the Human Resource Development Council as directed by Executive Order 16, fiscal year 1986-87.

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
